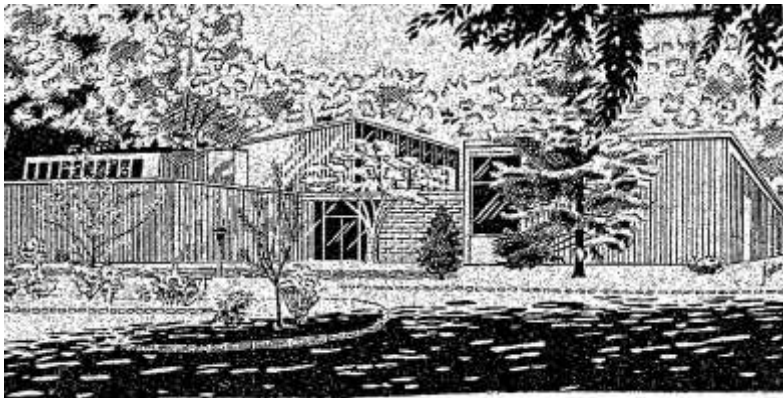

"EMPTY CHAIR AT THE SEDER"

Every year we join together at our Passover Seder to retell the story of our enslavement and our redemption.

The Empty Chair at the Seder Workshop offers a way for you to prepare for this holiday when a beloved family member or friend has died, if you are experiencing divorce, or if treasured loved ones are no longer able to join you at the Seder due to health challenges.

We may find ourselves dreading the Seder. How can you go through the same rituals when life has been altered so drastically? How do you confront your pain? Are we allowed to bring our sadness to the Seder?

Our hope is that this workshop will give you an opportunity to verbalize some of your thoughts and feelings by connecting with others, in conjunction with gaining an understanding of the insights and symbolism that we can learn from Pesach and the Seder table. Find ways to allow for grief and healing by being comforted in the themes of liberation and renewal.

Rabbi Lee

Most contemporary biblical scholars agree that the story of Esther was created to justify a pre-existent holiday that we call Purim. It seems that many in the ancient world marked the end of winter and the anticipation of spring with carnival-like celebrations that were complemented by disguises and adornments accompanied by over-eating and excessive drinking before a period of abstinence. (Think Mardi Gras before Lent.) The authors of the Scroll of Esther chose to build their story around the threat of Jewish annihilation, which was overturned at the last minute by Esther and Mordecai without the help of God, who is not even mentioned in the narrative.

The Purim story has other biblical parallels. Consider the Joseph saga, the story of a young Hebrew who came to Egypt as a slave and rose to high position only to have his progeny become enslaved for several hundred years before they are redeemed miraculously by God through the agency of the prophet Moses. This narrative, too, was woven around a pre-existent pagan festival that we Jews call Pesah, a feast that is followed by a fifty day long observance called the Counting of the Omer when merriment and public celebration is prohibited in traditional Jewish communities. It was the genius of our ancient ancestors to take an existent nature festival and transform it into a values-based holiday. Like all peoples in the world, we too mark the coming of spring by ingesting greens and eggs, both symbols of rebirth; but we do not rest content with that alone. Our Haggadah instructs that we recount our experience as slaves so that we might be a force to liberate those who are not yet free.

To add dimension to your *seder* this year, consider bringing a contemporary cause to include to include in your evening's narrative. Good sources to guide you include The American Jewish World Service (ajws.org) and The Religious Action Center (rac.org). Pesah teaches us not to neurotically dwell on our difficult past, but to take that experience so that we can address the needs of others who are not yet free.

I hope you have a joyous Pesah, one that will celebrate the end of snow and the blooming of crocuses, and one in which we can be instruments of renewal and healing in the world.

ADULT PROGRAMS and EDUCATION

ADULT STUDIES AND SEMINARS

Our congregation began its history with a seminar on Reconstructionism. It was only after a few years of people coming together to study the writings of Mordecai Kaplan that they decided to hold Shabbat and holiday services. By our engaging in these seminars, we keep alive the intention of our founders, that our spiritual experiences be tied to a self-conscious approach to Judaism grounded in an understanding of the Jewish People's history. To that end, Rabbi Lee will offer the following biweekly seminars.

Previous attendance at either of these seminars is not required, nor is regular attendance necessary. Call Lee at the office (627-6274) or at home (621-2067) with questions.

Biblical Texts: This group has been and continues to be committed to reading every word of the Hebrew Bible (in English translation). After more than a decade and a half, the group has reached the so-called Minor Prophets, minor not in importance, but in the amount of material that has survived of theirs. We will pick up the reading with the Book of Hosea and will move on to some of the more esoteric prophets including Joel and Obadiah. This seminar meets biweekly on Thursday nights from 8:00 to 9:30 p.m. **Dates this month are April 10th and 24th.**

The History of Israel: A Documentary Approach: We began our examination of Zionism five years ago through the lens of the writings of Zionist and anti-Zionist ideologues. Last year we arrived at the founding of the modern State and reached beyond to the Six Day War. We will continue to critically review the development of the State through original source political and sociological documents. This seminar meets biweekly on Shabbat afternoons from noon to 1:30p.m. **Dates this month are April 5th and 19th.**

CANTOR'S DINNER & STUDY GROUP

Traditional religious ritual was designed, and continues, to meet a variety of needs that relate to life passages: The need for the individual to be acknowledged by community, the need for the community/tribe to read itself into the passages of each member, the need for bonding, which serves both individual and community, the need to (re-)enact dramatically the great stories and messages of the tradition, for the sake of individuals and of the tradition. Through rituals, we create structures that provide an element of predictability and, therefore, safety, around times of insecurity, transition, and/or loss.

All women of our congregation are welcome to join us as we continue to study, and learn from each other. This year we will study the Torah portion of the week through women's commentaries. **Save the date for May 7th (Behar, Leviticus 25:1-26:2) which will be our next meeting.**

ADULT B'NAI MITZVAH GROUP

It is thrilling that 15 adults have chosen to make the commitment to engage in study during their adult years. This B'nay Mitzva experience has many components that will prove to make it an important two years. Especially meaningful is the development of a sense of community. We began the year with forming Hebrew reading groups. Thank you to Naomi Weinberg and Sheri Lindner who have served as peer language mentors. Different segments of the course of studies will be taught by Cantor Eric, Rabbi Lee and Rabbi Jodie. We will journey through historical, liturgical, literary and spiritual studies. Each student will engage in Torah study with a smaller group to deliver a *d'var torah* (discussion on the Torah portion), as well as participate in the culminating service as a group. **We meet weekly on Tuesdays, 8:00-9:30 p.m. through May 27, 2014 this year.**

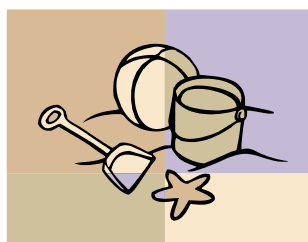
