# synagogue school

### Coordinated by Rabbi Jodie

Children build community within their age groups and come together in the study of Torah, Jewish Values and Acts of Ethical Kindness. Through song, prayer and stories they deepen their knowledge of Hebrew. We teach Torah as a living document which serves not only as a record of our people's experiences, but as a blueprint for our lives today.

Our synagogue school is integrated into our larger synagogue community and draws upon the resources of our congregation. We seek to create a caring community within our school, which reflects our congregation.

### Kindergarten, First Grade/Alef Thursdays, 4:15 - 6:15pm

We join in song and prayer with our youngest students, welcoming them into the Synagogue School learning community. Through a holiday-based curriculum, Hebrew as a living language, and family involvement, we integrate our youngest learners into the larger RSNS community. Each family may participate in the class by providing dinner for the students and by bringing a special ritual object from home for show and tell. **Start date 9/15** 

### Second - Sixth Grade/Bet - Vav

Families choose one of the two following educational options:

### Option 1. Shabbat School Tuesdays, 4:15 - 6:15pm, Friday evening or Saturday morning

This two day-a-week option addresses a desire for direct parental involvement in their child's Jewish education and fosters Shabbat learning. On Tuesdays, students get Hebrew instruction and attend school community programs including Tefilla Breira\* (electives) in groups with

Ashokan Trip! December 2-4, Grades 3-6 the Tuesday/Thursday students. The second day of attendance is either a Friday evening or a Saturday morning. One Friday evening each month (when family services are held), students engage in "classroom" activities from 6:00 - 7:25pm. At 7:30pm parents join their children for Family Services. The remaining sessions meet on Saturday mornings from 9:00 - 11:00am and include Torah study and services.





One Saturday a month includes a B'Yahad (literally "Together") service with Cantor Eric and Rabbi Jodie. A parent is required to attend the B'Yahad service with their child. For the first hour two simultaneous Torah study groups are held - one for adults and one for children. Parents and children then join together for a one hour family Shabbat service. The entire RSNS community is invited to attend both the adult Torah study and family service. Start date: 9/6. ### Option 2. Tuesdays/Thursdays, 4:15 - 6:15pm

Tuesdays are for Hebrew instruction and school community programs including Tefilla Breira\* (electives). Thursdays the focus is on Torah, Tefilla (prayer service), Jewish Values and Acts of Ethical Kindness.

#### \*Tefilla Breira (prayer electives) or "breirot"

Students have a chance to try something new by focusing on a particular type of prayer activity. They explore different ways to access prayer, for example, through storytelling, social action, yoga, Israeli dancing and creative writing sessions led by our staff.

### Kids' Choir with Cantor Eric Tuesdays, 6:15 - 6:30pm

The Kids' Choir is open to all synagogue school students in grades gimmel-vav. Kids learn contemporary Shabbat music (Camp JRF/NFTY tunes, folk songs, and other popular melodies). Kids' Choir sings at every Friday evening family service, and joins the adult choir for a special musical service in the winter. They also perform at nursing homes and community holiday events.

### Or Hadash with Morah Lauren Grades 4 - 6, Saturdays, 7:00 - 9:30pm

Our junior youth group is called Or Hadash or "New Light". Participants get together for monthly ice cream Havdalah movie nights, and take a trip to volunteer at a lewish soup kitchen in New York City, Dates: 9/17, 10/15, 12/10, 1/9 (trip), 2/4, 3/18, 4/22

Students in the Kadima year attend class every Tuesday. Once a month students are joined by their parents. Beginning with a day-long family retreat (9/10), we hope to form both a spiritual and a learning community where b'nai mitzvah students and their parents encounter Judaism through the eyes of the women, men and children who have helped shape our heritage.

We also hope to give each participant a common vocabulary as they continue to develop their own relationship with Judaism. Start date: 9/6



### Family D'Var Torah

The whole family has the opportunity to write and present on the bima a discussion of the Torah portion of the week in which their child becomes a bat/bar mitzvah. Following an introductory workshop on how to study Torah texts and prepare a d'var torah (literally: a word of Torah), families are given a copy of that Torah portion. After the family has read the text, Rabbi Jodie meets with the family to help guide them through the text, to answer questions, address issues, and help focus a course of study.

This program was established by Irving Roth, director of the Holocaust Resource Center at Temple Judea of Manhasset. Mr. Roth has organized a network of Holocaust survivors to serve as "adoptees" for our eighth grade students. These connections provide a vital link to the events of the Holocaust at a time when there are fewer survivors living to tell their own stories. The process begins with conversations between survivor and adopter. Through a series of meetings held at RSNS under Rabbi Jodie's supervision, the students become "surrogate survivors," committed to learning and re-telling their survivor's story to the next generation. Students in this program agree to speak about their survivors in the year 2045, the 100th anniversary of the camps' liberation. The initial session consists of a formal educational piece to provide students with general background information. Finally, students present their survivors' stories to the Synagogue School and during RSNS' Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Memorial) service. Parents are welcome, but not required to attend, and take turns providing food for each session.

### Bro's Hodesh with Cantor Eric Grades 8 - 12, Tuesdays, 6:30 - 8:00pm

Being a guy is not always so simple. In this boys-only group, we'll take an opportunity to explore what being a man – more specifically, a JEWISH man – means, and what we can learn about ourselves and each other.

# Girls Rosh Hodesh with Rabbi Jodie Grades 8 - 12

This program is based on the Jewish tradition of women's New Moon celebrations to build the self-esteem, Jewish identity, leadership skills, and friendship networks of adolescent girls. The monthly meetings provide a supportive environment where girls explore the social and cultural issues they encounter as they become adults and derive their own authentic Jewish values in response to the challenges they face. The small groups are designed to provide a celebratory, empowering setting in which girls support each other in growing and learning while having lots of fun. The program's success is due, in part, to the participatory mixture of discussing issues, traditions, and role models, making crafts and writing stories, rejoicing with song and dance, socializing, and munching. # Madrichim, coordinated by Rabbi Jodie Grades 8 - 12

Madrichim (Guides) are given assignments which include assisting in a classroom, or in the office, as a Hebrew tutor, or working one-on-one with students. During training sessions Madrichim enhance their Synagogue School experience through continued learning about Judaism, leadership, Jewish education, professional conduct and teaching techniques. Madrichim have the option of working Tuesday and/or Thursday, 4:00 - 6:30pm, once a month on Friday, 6:00 - 8:30pm, and/or Saturdays, 9:00 - II:00am. Madrichim can be paid or earn community service hours. Learning sessions are 9/I at 7:00pm, and II/22, I/24, 3/21, 5/9 from 6:30 - 7:30pm.



### Kulanu Grades 8 - 12 and parents Tuesdays, 6:30 - 8:00pm

Kulanu means **All of Us**. Teens and parents meet separately, at the same time, one Tuesday a month to learn and connect with each other. Pizza included.

**Grades 8-10** With Cantor Eric and Solomon, participants explore a wide range of engaging topics in fun, interactive ways!

**Grades II-I2** High school juniors and seniors learn from a series of guest experts what it takes to make it as a young adult looking ahead to college life! Topics include: Israel, Hillel, Sex, Drugs, Time Management, Politics and Making a Difference in The World.

**Parents** In the tradition of B'Yahad and Kadima, parents continue their own journeys as learners in this new monthly course: All About Reconstructionism! The topics will include God, Ritual Practice, Philosophy, Jewish Peoplehood and Reconstructionist History and Ideology.
