SYNAGOGUE SCHOOL REGISTRATION

It is now time to register for RSNS Synagogue School for the 2015-2016 academic year. Students currently enrolled in Synagogue School in grades kindergarten through vav have received re-registrations forms by mail. **All parents must complete the emergency contact information** on these registration form. Check the accuracy of all pre-printed information and return the completed form to RSNS with a deposit of \$250 per student by **June 1, 2015**.

Families will be billed over the summer for the balance of tuition. As usual tuition will be due in full by September 1. Only those members in good financial standing will be guaranteed a place for their children in the appropriate grade.

To register a child who has not yet attended our Synagogue School, stop by the office or call and we will mail you a registration form. Non-members are welcome to register for kindergarten and alef (first grade) based on available space.



The children and teachers came back to school after Passover and immediately began to make plans for celebrating Earth Day and Yom Ha Atzmaut. We used recycled objects in our art projects and created blue and white collages.

As the days are getting warmer and spring is in the air, we are observing the changes all around us. The toddlers are learning about trees and flowers and baby ducks and birds. The tadpoles in the four year olds classrooms are rapidly turning into frogs. Our three year olds are waiting patiently for their caterpillars to arrive so they can watch them turn into butterflies. Our teachers also have observed changes in the children in their classes---they seem to have blossomed and grown like the flowers all around us!

Water is back in the water tables in our classrooms and we are enjoying using the bikes, slides and climbers in our playgrounds again now that we can go outside more often. Lots of planting is taking place in the garden in our Outdoor Classroom. We are making beautiful presents for our Mom's for Mother's Day and we are looking forward to honoring the Torah on Shavuot with flowers and song.

Our annual picnic is Sunday May 17th from 11:00a.m. – 1:00 p.m. and features Yoga Jen.

Our last PJ Library Event for the year - celebrating Shavuot - Wednesday, May 20th at 5:30 p.m.

Save the date: Our 4's Moving Up Ceremony takes place on Friday June 19th at 9:15 a.m.

Registration continues for the fall and our fun filled seven week summer program.

For 7 weeks this summer, your child can have a wonderful experience at Gan Shalom. Our summer program begins June 29th and ends August 14th. This summer we will offer a four day or 5 day a week program. The three year olds will meet from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and the four year olds will meet from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. The fours will bring a dairy lunch from home daily. A daily ½ hour lunch extension is available for 3 year olds. Children will have the opportunity to play indoors in an air-conditioned classroom, and outdoors where **sprinklers** and a **water slide** will be available. Special activities are planned for each week of the program. Stop by the nursery school office for an application.

Toddler Programming

We are delighted to offer two types of programming for our toddlers this summer. Our Summer Program begins on Monday June 29 and ends on Friday August 14, 2015.

Our seven week Come Play With Me is a non-separating class for children turning two by December 1, 2015 with their parent or caregiver. We will be offering this class on Wednesdays from 9:30 - 11:00 a.m. Tuition will be \$225 for synagogue members and \$250 for non-members.

Our seven week Summer Twos class is a separating class for children who will be two by December 1, 2015. This class meets on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:30-11:30 a.m. Tuition is \$600 for synagogue members and \$650 for non-members.

Come play, paint, paste, sing and share snack with us this summer!! No bottles or pacifiers for these classes, please. All classes will meet in an air conditioned room and include water play in the playground.

Through rituals, we create structures that provide an element of predictability and, therefore, safety, around times of insecurity, transition, and/or loss. Rabbinic Mentorship Program

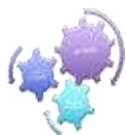
Georgette Kennebrae, our rabbinic intern, is visiting our congregation five times within the program year for a mentoring experience.

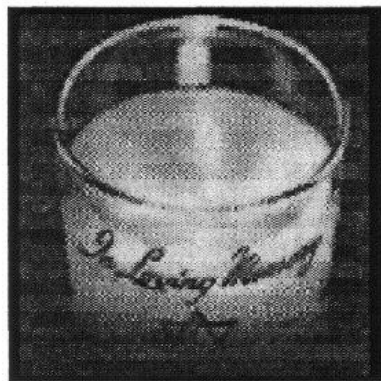
