(THURSDAY, JANUARY 11) Observance in awareness of Guantanamo Prison, 7:30 – 9:00 PM, UU Congregation at Shelter Rock, (48 Shelter Rock Rd).** January 11, 2018 marks the 16th anniversary of the opening of the detention facility at Guantanamo Bay. According to the National Religious Campaign Against Torture (NRCAT), dozens of people remain imprisoned there – most without charge or trial - well over a decade after they were first sent to Guantanamo. **We will gather to reject this symbol of torture and petition our government for its closure. • **TELL CONGRESS TO LET THEM IN!** The courts have repeatedly blocked the Muslim and refugee bans, but the current Administration continues to do everything it can to stop (heavily-vetted) refugees from finding safety in this country. As the Administration tries to implement harsh policies that slam the door on refugees, immigrants and asylum seekers, we must continue to show our support and do what we can to protect and welcome them. **Congress has the authority to maintain the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program** at a level proportionate to the global crisis and in line with our capacity, history and values. Please [take action today](#) and tell your representatives to **protect the refugee resettlement program**.

• **STOP THE HORRIFIC PERSECUTION OF THE ROHINGYA** Since the intensification of the ethnic cleansing in August, the American Jewish World Service has been providing humanitarian assistance for the Rohingya who are fleeing violent persecution. The Senate [introduced a bill](#) to provide humanitarian aid and re-establish sanctions against the Burmese military. We now need all Senators to come out in support of human rights and humanitarian assistance for the Rohingya people. The passage of this bill will only strengthen AJWS's efforts to combat the suffering of the Rohingya.
