Kulanu, 8-9TH graders, Tuesday nights Kulanu means "All of Us". This is a teen program, with a separate, simultaneous class taught by Rabbi Lee for parents. One Tuesday a month from 6:30-8pm (pizza included), participants will explore a wide range of engaging topics with Cantor Eric or Solomon in fun, interactive ways!

Parents In the tradition of B'Yahad and Kadima, parents have the option to continue their own journey as learners in this monthly course taught by Rabbi Lee. This year's topic: All About God.

Better Together (10th/11th grade)

Our 10th and 11th graders will meet monthly with RSNS adult seniors. Teens and seniors will engage in a different social justice topic each month. They will utilize an interactive curriculum created by renowned educator and former executive of Avoda Arts, Deb Krivoy. Seniors and teens will also collaborate on a culminating final project to be presented at our annual congregational meeting in June. Except for the first and last session, the program will meet at North Shore Towers in Little Neck. Dinner is included. Program is FREE for 10th/11th graders.

All participants submit an essay at the conclusion of the program, to be entered in a contest with a guaranteed RSNS first prize of \$5,000-8,000!

Spiritual Mentorship (all teens) An opportunity to explore personal experiences and challenges through the lens of Jewish texts and teachings. During individual meetings, we will explore how to find holiness and faith in both difficult and joyous moments. This is not therapy or counseling. Instead of focusing on solving problems, we'll look to Jewish sources as a perspective on the challenges and transitions of the teenage years. Solomon will meet with you once or twice a month over coffee/frozen yogurt. Educator Solomon Hoffman will mentor and Rabbi Jodie will supervise the program.

Created by guys, for guys. Grades 8-12. Tuesdays, 6:30-8pm, dinner included.

Being a guy is not always so simple. We like sports, and we like the arts. We like to hang out, and we like to do...well...stuff. In this boys-only group, we'll take an opportunity to explore what being a man – and more specifically, a JEWISH man – means, and what we can learn about ourselves and each other. Through activities, games, popular culture, food, discussions, and group experience, we'll take an opportunity to just be guys. Consistent participation is important for group bonding.

Bro's Hodesh is being offered this Fall in partnership with Moving Traditions; RSNS has been chosen to be part of a national pilot program involving cutting-edge programming for Jewish boys.

Grades 8-12, Tuesdays @ RSNS, 6:30-8:00pm, dinner included

This wonderful program, based on the Jewish tradition of women's New Moon celebrations, builds self-esteem, Jewish identity, leadership skills and friendship networks of adolescent girls. The monthly meetings provide a supportive environment where girls can explore the social and cultural issues they encounter as they become adults – and derive their own authentic Jewish values in response to the challenges they face. The small groups are designed to provide an empowering set-







ting in which girls can support each other in growing and learning while having lots of fun, with a participatory mix of discussing issues, traditions, and role models; making crafts and writing stories, rejoicing with song and dance, socializing, and munching. Consistent articipation is necessary for group bonding.

RSNS Madrichim Program 2017-2018 Covenant & Fact Sheet

What are madrichim? Madrich (singular) is the Hebrew for "guide." Madrichim will:

- ATTEND A MANDATORY ORIENTATION ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 7 at 7:00 P.M.
- Be compensated for their work or can earn community service hours
- Help teachers get supplies and organize students and lessons, tutor students, help in the office
- Be expected to arrive and leave on time, and keep absences to situations of illness and the like
- Enhance their experience in Synagogue School through their own continued learning (in training sessions)
- Continue to learn about Judaism, leadership, Jewish education, professional conduct and teaching techniques as part of their training
- Be evaluated on their general progress and job performance
- Commit to work ONE OR MORE days a week, depending on the Synagogue School's needs and the *madrich's* abilities, <u>consistently on the same schedule every week</u>.
- Attend training sessions throughout the year
- Be assigned to a classroom & teacher, the office, as a Hebrew tutor, or to work one-on-one with students.

Available days to work are Tuesdays, 4:00-6:30 p.m., Thursdays, 4:00-6:30 p.m.,

Fridays, 5:45-7:30 p.m. (Fridays are once a month), Saturdays, 8:45-11:15 a.m.

We strongly encourage everyone to participate in Kesher Hadash and Bros Hodesh or Girls Rosh Hodesh. We are confident that you would greatly benefit from those programs. However, this is not required for your participation in the *Madrichim* program.

You can apply for a *madrich/a* position in the Synagogue School by **completing the tear-off at the bottom of this page.** Return to RSNS as soon as possible. Rabbi Jodie will contact you with your placement information.
